HoNOSI scoring and subscales

All HoNOSI items are answered on an item-specific anchored four-point scale with higher scores indicating more problems. A total score is calculated as the sum of the scores for items 1 to 13 only, with a range 0 to 52. Items scored 9 or with missing data are generally excluded from the calculation.
